

## **Questioning The Author - QtA**

Adapted from Buehl, D. (2013)

Step 1: Students read an assigned text.

Step 2: Identify the major understandings students need to gain, and any potential problems anticipated in order to grasp text meaning.

Step 3: Establish stopping points by placing asterisks in the text to begin questioning and discussion.

Step 4: Pre-develop queries for each stopping point; use as initial discussion-starters followed up by probing beneath to discover connections, bridge with students' existing and prior knowledge. Examine author argument, evidence and reasoning.

Step 5: Give students clues that they will dig deeper than typically done by applying questioning strategies. Arrange desks in a U-shape to accommodate discussion.

Step 6: In discussion, use "moves" to model the reconstruction of text by questioning author's ideas. Use the techniques below:

Turn back and re-read as needed
Use re-voicing
Modeling thinking
